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## Pi Leau Expansion Programme

Aims for the programme:

- To give the immediate 'Stade community' a strong sense of ownership of the project
- To enable the wider Hastings community to achieve buy in to the project
- To maximise the profile, impact and legacy potential for the project

There are three broad strands:

**Community Engagement & Impact**. Primarily about good communication and information about the project plus the development of complementary programming on and about the Stade. Workshops with members of the Close Act company offer the opportunity to reach out to neighbourhoods beyond the Stade and will lead to pop up performances in the Town Centre on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup>, taking the show to the town and publicising the evening performance. Much of this programme will be built into delivery of the project – performance, venue management, front of house and promotion.

**Capacity Building**. This will be focused on the immediate Stade community through practical initiatives linked to delivery of the project, front of house 'venue' management and marketing aspects. Additional opportunities can be built in for local event producers etc to have access to the production team in the run up to the presentations and then to the later stages of the project – technical and dress rehearsals with mediated access to the Close Act team - or as volunteers on the project. Some local employment opportunities are feasible.

**Professional Development**. This programme will offer opportunities to the professional outdoor arts sector via local 'sponsors' such as local authorities. Additional opportunity will be available to local professional and some semi-professional technicians and crew, both employed and volunteer.

The programme will be delivered for Hastings Borough Council by MSL Projects in association with GD FI, the Stade Partnership and other partners to be confirmed.

## **MSL Projects**

MSL specializes in the delivery of celebratory events and programmes. With offices in Hastings and London the company works with arts and cultural sector agencies, creative industries SMEs, government, regeneration, social change and third sector organisations. As well as developing and delivery of both large and small-scale performance events the company provides capacity building and organisational development support, project planning and management.

The Street Procession/Pop Up performances will be managed by MSL Projects working in partnership with GDF. Stewarding, security, first aid etc will be coordinated with Hastings partners within the overall Event Management Plan.

Margaret Sheehy has managed festival and carnival events throughout the UK notably: Royal Opening, Glasgow Garden Festival; two large-scale Millennium Eve events and fireworks; the Beijing Torch Relay event for the British Museum and LB Camden; numerous small-scale street events.

  - 1 member of the company will work with up to 18 people artist/makers, producers, events managers in 2 sessions of 1,5 hour. These sessions are currently being advertised with bursaries on offer to professional and semi-professional participants.
- In addition there will be mediated observer opportunities during get in and rehearsal on Friday 22 June to include break out conversations with the artistic directors, performers and production crew for up to 10 participants (performers, event managers & producers). This group will have a minder and remain well back from the production activity and will engage with the artistic and production teams at times to be agreed.

# Street Procession/Pop up Performances – 23 June 2012

It is proposed to offer a street procession and pop up performances on Saturday 23 June in Hastings Town Centre and Alexandra Park where it will feature in the annual Pathways to Construction event. The procession will include the use of drums (acoustic) and performers will carry large flags. Hand flares will be used. All of these as will be used in the performance and are described in the main Event Management Plan. The number of performers is yet to be determined and actual routes and timings are still to be agreed. The procession will be stewarded. A full risk assessment will be carried out once the route has been agreed. See attached maps for the proposed routes. Transfer to the performance areas will be either by mini bus or Happy Harold (requested).



Close-Act Theatre brings strong visual street theatre in larger than life spectacles. Previous performances, such as Malaya or the mobile acts Saurus, STX and White Wings were shown on renowned international theatre festivals in e.g. Canada, Brazil, Taiwan, Colombia and throughout Europe. The shows combine theatre, stilts, music, fire, dance, metal constructions and aerial objects. The audience is always their stage.

#### **PI-LEAU**

PI represents the infinite number  $\Pi$  (3,142 857 142 857 etc.) LEAU represents the France word water. Much WATER.

Pi-Leau is a multidisciplinary concept where installation, puppet, music and dance theatre come together. The audience becomes involved as mobiles and actors move around. Like the sea, the crowd finds its way around the obstacles, through the open spaces.

The audience has an important role in this interactive street theatre play.

How do we survive as the water rises? Icebergs melt, the sea level rises and the earth is covered with water. Animal instincts arise as mankind fights for its existence. Water scooters, divers and hunters are in aggressive search for domination of this water world. In the middle of this madness we see a peace-loving and solitary fisherman, who is open-minded to the new world surrounding him. Because of this, he discovers something extremely beautiful that the other survivors do not see: mermaids, a mystery that must be hidden from the divers of a large motorboat who terrorize the sea with their harpoons and large fishing nets.
